This month we are combining the newsletters of Emmanuel and Zion.

From the Desk of Pastor Lee... April 2024

"As [Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James, and Salome] entered the tomb, they saw a young man, dressed in a white robe, sitting on the right side; and they were alarmed. But he said to them, 'Do not be alarmed; you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has been raised; he is not here. Look, there is the place they laid him. But go, tell his disciples and Peter that he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him, just as he told you.' So they went out and fled from the tomb, for terror and amazement had seized them; and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid."—Mark 6:5-8

This is how the Gospel according to Mark ends. There are some other verses that are printed after, but the earliest manuscripts we have for Mark has the Gospel ending at verse eight. The overwhelming opinion of scholars recognizes that the verses that follow verse eight, which are usually indicated in our Bibles as different endings for Mark, are later additions to Mark's original work.

Speculation exists as to why these verses were added. It was not uncommon in the years when the Bible was being compiled for students or followers to complete unfinished works of their masters. It could have been that the last part of Mark was lost and that the added verses were an attempt at a restoration. However, it could have been that people were just uncomfortable with Mark's original ending and felt in needed to be "finished."

I lean to the later explanation because of the overall structure of Mark's Gospel. The way we record history today is usually through a set of dates and chronological facts. This was not necessarily the case 2,000 years ago, and Mark is a prime example of this. Unlike Matthew and Luke, Mark begins just as abruptly as it ends. There is no birth narrative in Mark and no genealogy. The beginning of Mark is Jesus' baptism, the ripping open of the heavens for the descending Holy Spirit, and Jesus beginning his proclamation that the Kingdom of God has come near. Indeed, Mark's Gospel is the exploration and a revealing of this coming kingdom that culminates with Jesus' journey to the cross. And Mark, unlike a history textbook, writes his account in such a way that he invites us not simply to hear the story, but to be part of the story. And as we hear Mark's account, remember that early Christians were not exposed to all four Gospel accounts as we have today. Each account is unique in its details and emphasis.

And so, on that Easter morning, Mark brings us along with Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome to the tomb, surprising us as we find it open. When we go into the tomb, a young man dressed in a white robe (not an angel as in some of the other accounts) addresses us, revealing the news that Jesus has risen from the dead. Our job is to go tell the disciples that Jesus will meet them in Galilee as the young man said. The women, however, flee in terror and say nothing to anyone. Now of course, historically, the women did say something, otherwise there would be no Christianity. But the truth with which Mark confronts us is not rooted in historical fact, but in faith. Now we are at the tomb. Now we hear the voice of the young man in white. We see the women flee and say nothing because of terror. Mark's ending asks the question of us who stand alone at the empty tomb, "Will you tell that Jesus goes ahead of us Galilee, or will we flee in fear, too?" This is the "truth" in which Mark leaves us, not the facts of a story but how we will respond as part of the story. This unique ending is what makes Mark my favorite.

This year is the year of Mark, although the lectionary gives us the option of substituting John's account every year. I challenge us to stay with Mark. It does not give us the poetic and familiar resurrection story to which we may be accustomed since the resurrected Jesus never actually appears in the original Mark ending, but Mark challenges us to respond to the Kingdom of God that still breaks into our world through Jesus who goes before us and who promises to meet us, not just at the tomb, but in the world that God so loves.

2024 APRIL LESSER FESTIVALS & COMMEMORATIONS

Date	Event Name	Introduction
Monday, April 1, 2024	Annunciation of Our Lord	The angel Gabriel announces that the love of God for humanity will take shape in the body of the blessed virgin Mary. The letter to the Hebrews announces that humanity has been hallowed "through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all." Isaiah announces Immanuel, whose name means "God with us." That God would take on human form, offer his life for ours, and keep company with us our whole life long overshadows any other love. Celebrate the announcement!
Thursday, April 4, 2024	Benedict the African, confessor, died 1589	Born into slavery on the island of Sicily, Benedict lived as a hermit until the pope ordered all hermits to attach themselves to a monastery, at which time Benedict joined the Franciscans. Though illiterate, he was highly respected as a confessor and later superior of his community.
	Albrecht Dürer, died 1528; Matthias Grünewald, died 1529; Lucas Cranach, died 1553; artists	These great artists revealed through their work the mystery of salvation and the wonder of creation. Dürer's work reflected the apocalyptic spirit of his time. Though he remained a Roman Catholic, he was sympathetic to Martin Luther's reforming work. Grünewald's paintings are known for their dramatic forms, vivid colors, and depiction of light. Cranach's work includes many fine religious examples and several portraits of Martin Luther. Cranach was also widely known for his woodcuts.
	Dietrich Bonhoeffer, theologian, died 1945	Bonhoeffer was a German theologian who wrote profoundly, yet in an accessible manner. In the Second World War, he became a leader of the Confessing Church in Germany that resisted the Nazi movement. Linked to a plot to kill Hitler, he was hanged shortly before the end of the war.
Wednesday, April 10, 2024	Mikael Agricola, Bishop of Turku, died 1557	Consecrated bishop of Turku, Finland, without the approval of the pope, Agricola began a reform along Lutheran lines. In only three years, he translated the New Testament and worship texts into Finnish, in the process establishing the rules of Finnish writing that are still used today.
Friday, April 19, 2024	Olavus Petri, priest, died 1552; Laurentius Petri, Bishop of Uppsala, died 1573; renewers of the church	These two brothers studied with Luther at the University of Wittenberg and then returned to their native Sweden to introduce the Lutheran reforms. Olavus published a catechism and hymnal; Laurentius was a professor who defended the office of bishop and later became one.
Sunday, April 21, 2024	Anselm, Bishop of Canterbury, died 1109	This eleventh-century monk was one of the greatest theologians of the Middle Ages. He is remembered for emphasizing the maternal aspects of God, and for the theory that the Son of God became human in order to make the necessary payment for our sin.
		This observance invites us to notice and give God thanks for the wonders of the created universe. As stewards of that creation, we are also challenged to be careful in our use of it.
Tuesday, April 23, 2024	Toyohiko Kagawa, renewer of society, died 1960	Born in Kobe, Japan, Kagawa was orphaned as a young child. Later, when he became Christian, he was disowned by the rest of his family. Wishing to bring Christian principles into society, he worked among poor people, established schools and hospitals, and worked for peace.
Thursday, April 25, 2024	Mark, Evangelist	He was not numbered among the twelve apostles, yet Mark was probably a member of the early church community. The gospel that bears his name is the shortest and most direct, and many scholars think it was the first to be written.
Monday, April 29, 2024	Catherine of Siena, theologian, died 1380	This theologian was the first woman among Roman Catholics to receive the title "Doctor [teacher] of the Church." Catherine was a Dominican sister known for her mystical visions as well as her work on behalf of people who were poor and imprisoned.
